11. How would you rate this book on a scale of 1 to 10?

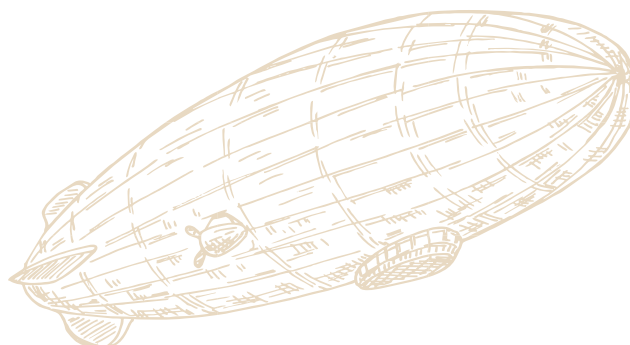

#### Story Questions

1. Compare and Contrast the Millennial Kingdom within the protected borders to the Outer Darkness. Which place would you prefer to live and why?
2. Given the high risk in bringing orphans inside the gates of the kingdom cities, do you think if you were king you would do otherwise or alter the age of acceptance in?
3. How do you feel about Hiram's sentence in the Outer Darkness being shortened? Fair/Unfair/doesn't matter Jesus is King.
4. Discuss the events that led to Ruth and her baby's death. Could the sabotage have been avoided? What about Ruth's decision to not heed her mother's counsel?
5. What do you think about the resurrected saints not having distinguishing loves or loyalties as the mortal saints within the kingdom?
6. What do you think about information being kept from a larger portion of the population for protection? Appropriate or not and why?
7. What do you think about the way the Millennial Kingdom goes about education and learning vocations of interest?
8. While the Millennial Kingdom of Jesus Christ functions much like communism with those within receiving according to their needs and capability of function, how is the kingdom function much more superior than our current communist government structures?
9. How do the Millennial Kingdom's technological and archaeological advancements differ from our own? Would you say they are more or less in harmony with the natural function of our earth?
10. Do you think creativity within new projects and inventions of the Millennial Kingdom are more or less hindered than the structure we have in place today?



## Character Questions

1. Given all that Abigail had gone through in her life, how do you surmise she found herself in the vulnerable situation that led to her rape?
2. In what ways was Hiram just as if not more responsible for Abigail's rape than she was?
3. Do you think the discipline enacted upon Hiram and Abigail was too harsh, not harsh enough or fitting for their specific situation?
4. Compare Lillah's outlook on Jesus' Kingdom with Rahab's? How does each of these effect their lives differently in the Outer Darkness?
5. Do you think Ruth's response to her mother was justified? How might the knowledge of Joram and his brother Shechem be handled better by Abigail with her girls?
6. Do you think Abigail's direct and honest approach with Joram at dinner was effective and/or appropriate?
7. Justice and Creeda though having shared a womb and a love for Ruth are so very different. Do you think their parents did well in encouraging them into different directions with their interests?
8. Do you think Creeda handled his envy for Justice and Ruth well? How might you have reacted?
9. How do you feel about Abigail's sudden tenderness for Musor in the midst of her pain? Why might she be so quick to open her arms to this child? Is this a healthy response to grief in your opinion?
10. Do you think Clara's response to Abigail was justified when learning about the suspicion of her adopted children Noam and Irena? Discuss how blind love and loyalty can effect rational thinking.
11. After many years Abigail is finally learning to let go of her children. Can you relate?
12. Discuss Abigail's final resolve to tranquillity, relinquishing control back to her Savior Jesus?

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## Millennial Reign Questions

1. How do you feel about many generations knowing their distant greatsomes? Strange? Beneficial?
2. How is the view of death and loss in the Millennial Kingdom different or similar from ours?
3. Willow Winds, while quite large as a farm, functions more like a homestead than our current large farms? How do you see these differences? Good? Bad? Just different?
4. Compare and contrast the celebrations from the Millennial Kingdom with those we participate in today. How might we do better in celebrating what our savior Jesus Christ did for us in redemption?
5. Discuss the option for the Kingdom's mortal saints to choose refraining from drinking the Living Water. Do you feel it is individual choice or that as a believer you should want to live to the fullest for your Savior during this time of testing as long as He sees fit? What variables are there?
6. How do our choices and willingness to serve Jesus Christ work into the ultimate will and plan of our creator?
7. What do you think about all the activities being displayed in the Outer Darkness? Do you think those are being dealt with justly? Harshly? Not harshly enough?
8. If you were King of this kingdom, how would you run your kingdom? Do you think you could make the decisions in that delicate balance of justice and mercy in those many lives?

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
